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


Dear Parents, Caregivers & Students,

Class Teachers' Report

Stage K&1 Ms. Sun

Our theme this term was *Personal & Social life*. Specifically, we learnt the language to talk about countries of birth and occupations. We learnt to ask questions, such as, where is your family from? and what occupation do you want to have when you grow up? We also learned about how to use adjectives to describe ourselves and others. The great thing about these topics is the opportunity it gives the students to reuse their vocabulary. This helps with deep learning of the language.

We had a special cultural activity this term to celebrate *Dragon Boat Festival*. In this activity we explained the origins of the festival, and explored some of it related traditional activities associated. One tradition of the festival is making a special rice dumpling wrapped in bamboo leaves called *zong* zi (粽子). The students had a great time to learn make *zong* zi (粽子)



During our classes, we engaged in many class activities to assist with language learning, which included using audio-visual resources, such as, Youtube video clips. The videos help students retain and use new words. We also played games to support vocabulary development, such as the bingo game, go fishing and Quizshow. Activities such as these help the students practise speaking, develop listening abilities and build reading skills. These activities also provide a great way to review what we learn in the class.

Audio files have been included in the class notes (PPT) to help students with pronunciation of vocabulary and sentences. A wonderful way to build on these great achievements is to help your child practise them at home. Also there are some good apps that make learning fun while helping to develop their language skills. Please encourage continued engagement with the language over the holidays.

Stage 2&3 Ms. Tan

The sub-topics for this term are built around the theme of "Family".

Class activities were planned for students to first introduce themselves, and then their family members, as well as their extended family members throughout the term. Since the students already have prior knowledge of the terms for the immediate family, we thus focussed on the terms for the extended family. The Chinese people have different terms of address for their extended family members from the paternal and maternal sides. For example, the grandparents from the paternal side are addressed as yéye (grandpa) and năinai (grandma), and from the maternal side are addressed as wàigōng (grandpa) and wàipó (grandma).

We took the opportunity to review some of the sub-topics, such as colours, parts of the body and food, covered in our previous learning when students did their self-introduction. At the same time, students also learnt adjectives to describe their physical appearance such as the colour of their eyes and hair, etc. Lastly, students were encouraged to draw an extended family tree which they used as a prop to introduce their extended family members to their classmates. Students' listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills were honed through a variety of language practice tasks and activities such as Questions & Answers (Q&A) speaking tasks, online games, YouTube video clips, oral presentations, as well as print and online worksheets.

Students will reap benefits from their Chinese learning if they are able to make the effort to review the Chinese words and expressions regularly after class so that they can commit what they have learnt to their long-term memory. Students should also try to practice speaking Chinese whenever the opportunity arises, e.g., when they visit their extended Chinese family members or Chinese friends, etc.

Finally, I wish you and your family a safe and fulfilling holiday. Hope to see you all in Term 3!


